

Public Safety Alert, Warden Avenue and McNicoll Avenue area, Sexual Assault investigation, Update, Third incident reported

On Tuesday, March 7, 2017, the Toronto Police Service issued a Public Safety Alert connected with a Sexual Assault investigation in the Warden Avenue and McNicoll Avenue area.

See excerpt from previous news release:

The Toronto Police Service is advising the public of a Sexual Assault investigation.

It is reported that:

- on Saturday, February 18, 2017, at approximately 6:30 p.m., a 53-year-old woman was walking in the Warden Avenue and McNicoll Avenue area
- a man approached the woman from behind and sexually assaulted her before fleeing on foot
- on Saturday, February 25, 2017, at approximately 8:30 p.m., a 25-year-old woman got off a bus in the same area
- it is believed the same man approached this woman from behind and sexually assaulted her before fleeing on foot

The man is described as black with a darker skin tone, 5'-5'6", with a thin-to-medium build, possibly in his early 20s.

He may have been wearing a dark bomber jacket, or an orange hooded jacket with black lines down the sleeves, and black jeans. He was carrying an orange backpack with tie-downs on the front in one report, and a dark knapsack or dufflebag in the other report.

It is now reported that:

- on Tuesday, March 28, 2017, at approximately 4:20 p.m., the same man approached a 13-year-old girl from behind while she was walking in the Birchmount Avenue/McNicoll Avenue area
- he sexually assaulted her before fleeing on foot

The man is described as brown, 5'7"-5'9", slim build, in his 20s, with black hair, glasses and all-black clothing.

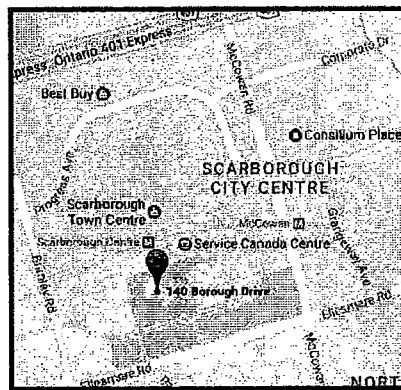


Budget Ward Forum

Your voice is important.



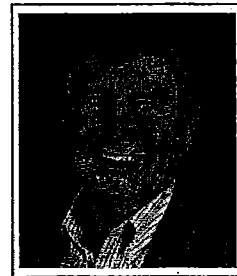

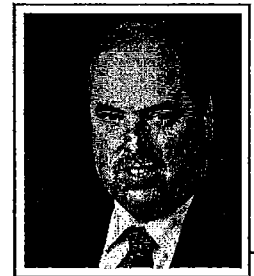
